With an international reputation as one of the most popular brass ensembles today, Canadian Brass has truly earned the distinction of "the world's most famous brass group".

Masters of concert presentations, Canadian Brass has developed a uniquely engaging stage presence and rapport with audiences. Each of their concerts will show the full range from trademark Baroque and Dixieland tunes to new compositions and arrangements created especially for them – from formal classical presentation to music served up with lively dialogue and theatrical effects.

Whatever the style, the music is central and performed with utmost dedication, skill and excellence. The varied Canadian Brass repertoire features brass standards as well as a wide-ranging library of more than 600 original arrangements. With a discography of over 130 albums including several videos and an extensive world-wide touring schedule, Canadian Brass continues to score Billboard chart positions.

They are an important pioneer in bringing brass music to mass audiences everywhere throughout the USA, Canada, Japan and Europe. They have toured South America, the Soviet Union, the Middle East and Australia. They were the first brass ensemble from the West to perform in the People's Republic of China as well as the first brass group to take the main stage at the venerable Carnegie Hall.

Exclusive artists for Conn-Selmer Musical Instruments, the five play on state-of-the-art 24K gold-plated Artisan Bach and Conn horns, hand crafted in the USA.

With four decades under their belts, Canadian Brass continues to thrill audiences around the world – and they don't look like they are letting up anytime soon.

DR. GILBERT CORELLA, PRINCIPAL CONDUCTOR

Dr. Corella has been with the Loudoun Symphonic Winds since 1999. He began his musical career with the United States Air Force Band. He performed as a tubist with the Ceremonial Brass, participating in ceremonies ranging from State arrivals at the White House to full



honors funerals at Arlington National Cemetery. He also represented the Air Force as a soloist and clinician at conferences worldwide.

He later moved into administration to become the Director of the Air Force Band's Chamber Series program and eventually joined the public affairs team. There, he built partnerships with civilian and other military organizations to promote the Air Force's public image. He managed radio and television productions as well as represented the Air Force at international music education conferences. After serving 25 years, he retired as the Director of Special Events.

As a civilian, Dr. Corella developed an instrumental ensemble program at Charles County Community College (today College of Southern Maryland). He also recorded on several compact discs, including *The Bear (Unnatural Ax); Side by Side, A Klezmer Service, National Taptoe,* and *Tower Music.* In 2003, he founded the Serapis Foundation, whose mission is to educate and stimulate awareness on the diversity of musical expression with a focus on diverse and economically challenged children.

His degrees include a Bachelor of Arts from the Catholic University of America; a Masters of Arts in conducting and performance from George Mason University; and a Doctorate of Musical Arts from the Catholic University of America as the first-ever graduate in tuba performance. He has been teaching tuba and euphonium at George Washington University since 1999.

In his spare time he serves as a full-time communications consultant for the federal government.
